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ALPIN HAUS CELEBRATES ITS 60TH YEAR IN BUSINESS IN 2024

Alpin Haus had humble beginnings when in 1964 the then small business opened its doors with one full-time employee and a handful of helpers and founders. Bud Heck and John Daly were the original owners then. Today, the Heck family continues on the tradition, but now Alpin Haus is one of the leading outdoor recreational retailers in the northeast. The company employs over 200 people at seven locations in the Capital Region, downstate New York, and northern New Jersey. Specifically, there are two locations in Amsterdam (Route 5S features their RVs, and a newly expanded Ski, Pool and Boat shop are at the Route 30 location), an RV shop in Saratoga, a ski shop in Clifton Park, RV locations in Middletown, NY and Oak Ridge, NJ, and ski shop in Latham.

Jamie Georgelos, Director of Alpin Haus' ski and pool division, sat down with us to talk about the business, where he has been employed for 27 years. He tells us that the Heck family has been at the heart of the business since it started. Fast forward from 1964 to 1994 (30 years after it was founded) when Greg and Andy Heck purchased John Daly's share of the company and it became solely owned by the Heck family. Andy's and Greg's sister, Katie Osborn, soon joined the family in the business. All three are very involved with the business, as it continues to grow and prosper. This multi-generational influence on the company is important as the industries with which it is involved continue to evolve and change. In addition, the long-tenured, seasoned staff mixes so well with the influx of a younger generation as they all comprise the Alpin Haus team.

The multi-generational workforce is just one of the reasons that Alpin Haus is a great place to work, but it is also great because Alpin Haus is really in the business of selling fun. The business sells RVs, pools, ski equipment, boats, snowmobiles, and parts and service for all of these divisions. Once you're in the business, there is a lot of opportunity to work in a division in which you are especially interested. There is also room for growth within each division. Jamie noted that the excellent customer service and how the team treats customers is evidence of the happiness of the team. "We really all help each other out when needed, and that keeps the entire team strong."

Alpin Haus also enjoys, and fosters, its family-oriented atmosphere. The team gets together on golf outings, ski outings, days at the Saratoga Race Track, and much more. They have really fostered a great team atmosphere. In addition, they are constantly developing people with senior management providing many opportunities to learn—with classes, coaching and mentoring,

and more. They also started an Alpin Haus University where up and coming managers are trained, and that has also been a great retention tool and so beneficial for the employees.

The history of the company is so interesting and the growth of the company can be seen during its entire 60-year history. There is a timeline, with photos, of Alpin Haus, in the expanded (late 2023) pool and patio section, housed in the former fitness center. In the back near the restrooms there is a hallway in which you can view the timeline of the business.

2025 will bring a renovated boat showroom to the Route 30 location. Both the patio/pool expansion and the boat showroom used local contractors and other companies to get the projects done. In addition, you can see Alpin Haus' name on many events as a sponsor, including Amsterdam's ice rink and splash pad, as they continue to reinvest not only in the business, but also in the community.

All during the expansion of the business, Alpin Haus has strived to do business locally whenever and wherever they can. Jamie Georgelos says about shopping small and local, "In an era where you can buy anything online, having small businesses thrive is a credit to our region. Small businesses employ so many of those who live in our region, and offer the products and services that you need."

Alpin Haus is an important part of our region—yesterday, today, and hopefully for many more years to come. Congratulations on 60 great years in business!

518RENOVATIONS PROVIDES GENERAL CONTRACTING SERVICES FOR YOUR HOME OR OFFICE

[518Renovations](#), located at 117 Van Road, Gloversville, offers home renovation and remodeling services including kitchen and bath renovations, decks, flooring, additions, basement renovations, sunrooms, painting, siding, garage builds and more. They also do commercial office remodeling and repairs. They recently repaired the Chamber office where we had some water damage to our lobby. They have remodeled over 30 homes in Gloversville and beyond.

One of the things that sets 518 Renovations apart is the opportunity for their clients to access online information about their projects. Barry Chapin, II, a manager at 518 Renovations said that this online initiative was originally set up because many of their customers were seasonal and this gives these out of area customers 24/7 access to see what's going on with their projects. The business is also looking to purchase homes to remodel/renovate for rentals, and

they also offer residential property management as another service.

518Renovations is currently remodeling their showroom, office space, and storage space at their Van Road address. They have been working for 8 months on it and are more than halfway done with this project. They expect to finish in spring of 2025. In the showroom, they will feature local products they like using, as well as highlighting other local businesses with whom they work. Barry added that "we try to use local products and services as much as we can. We appreciate every business who we work with locally."

518Renovations currently has 10 employees that they appreciate. Barry said, "We get to know our team members, they aren't just a number to us. We ask our employees to do some really labor-intensive work, and we appreciate all they do. We not only get to know them well, but we also get to know their family so we can also appreciate and thank them."

The company started in 2018 with three employees, flipping houses locally. During this time, they realized the need for good reliable general contractors, and they set out to fulfill that need. Even during COVID, they kept everyone employed, sending out one person for every job to keep the employees and customers safe.

The business' culture is also very important to them and employees who are a good fit for this culture is also important. Since 518Renovations started an emphasis on and cultivating their corporate culture, not one employee has left. In fact, Barry offered his three measures of success, the first being return customers and customer referrals, secondly is the success of his team, and third, seeing company profit.

For 2025, 518Renovations will start offering new house building. They have the talent, and want to put their talented employees to their best use for customers.

IMPORTANT HEALTH INSURANCE INFORMATION

Chamber of Commerce Billing Changes Effective January 1st, 2025

OneDigital is the Chamber's partner in health insurance and offers plans for sole proprietors or businesses with one or more employees. As we transition from 2024 to 2025, we want to prepare you for changes to the health insurance billing process if you have insurance through OneDigital. OneDigital will no longer issue centralized billing nor administer central banking. Instead, the insurance carriers for which you have active enrollment will bill you directly. Bills are generated between the 4th and the 12th of each month for the subsequent month. OneDigital will continue their central billing services only through the balance of the calendar year, with direct billing taking effect for the January invoices.

Below we have included a list of the OneDigital services that will continue with our Chamber and a description of the billing service transition from centralized billing to direct billing. **REMINDER: OneDigital will still be offering plans, but the billing will be different, which is explained in the new guide—[access here](#):**

- Eligibility maintenance.
- Eligibility upload to carrier portals.
- System of record (Employee Navigator) – OneDigital keeps a record of all enrollments in employee navigator. We encourage groups to utilize system-based enrollment, which we sponsor and pay for, as an additional service.
- Centralized billing - **This is the service we will discontinue effective January 1, 2025.** OneDigital downloads and combines all Chamber member groups bills from various carriers, then issues a consolidated / centralized bill to each member group.
- New hire support – OneDigital provides employee support for new hires, through communications and Q&A.
- Ongoing day to day services - member groups and employees of reach out to OneDigital for concierge services related to provider billing errors, denied claims, inquiries about the plan, description of explanation of benefits, provider location services and more.
- Open enrollment support – OneDigital will manage and convey updates regarding renewal cost changes, plan modifications, recommendations, carrier synchronization, as well as new carrier relationships and opportunities. OneDigital prepares communications for members and open enrollment packets, then assists with open enrollment through educational meetings conducted in person, by phone, or via Zoom, along with providing one-on-one time with members.
- As active members of the Chamber, you are familiar with receiving plans and rate grids via physical mail. This year, all benefits will be available in your **online Benefit Guide which can be viewed here: <https://view.onedigital.com/fultonmontgomerychamberofcom>**

- **Open enrollment eligibility management** - OneDigital gathers enrollment change information directly for each member group. For this year's Open Enrollment, it is strongly recommended that enrollment changes be delivered to OneDigital by **December 6th, 2025**. This will allow for the most accurate January invoices.

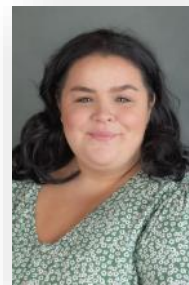
